NEWS FROM LIS & EDWARD

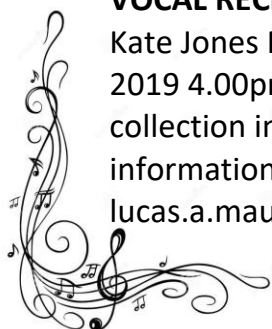

ALISON KOTROCI AT LOGOS STUDIO, ALBANIA Alison, sister of Jonathan Smith, first went to Albania in 1997, while it was still a largely closed country, to help the fledgling Albanian church. There she met and married Mozi and settled permanently with their three children, Emily, Nicola and Sebi.

Mozi had previously had 9 years of experience in radio and television, a platform he used to make shows with a spiritual message. Together Mozi and Alison set up Logos Studio in 2001 to make or translate Christian films into the Albanian language - a much needed resource in this former atheist and now increasingly materialistic country.

Logos has produced over 30 titles and these are distributed throughout Albania via churches, missionary organisations and many are broadcast on television stations throughout the country, reaching Albanians not only in Albania but also in Macedonia and Kosovo. Logos also send their films to people working amongst Albanians across the world, in particular in America and the UK.



MICHELANGELO'S SISTINE CHAPEL: A DIFFERENT VIEW makes its UK premiere in Winchester this summer (July 5th till September 29th)

The exhibition will be on show at three venues across the city: City Space and The Gallery in Winchester Discovery Centre and the Great Hall.

The exhibition comes to Winchester after touring major European cities including Copenhagen and, most recently, Amsterdam. Officially licensed by the Vatican Museums, the exhibition will allow unprecedented closeness to the magnificent works which adorn the chapel ceiling, normally 22 metres above visitors' heads.

Working in partnership with the Vatican Museums, the frescoes have been photographed, reproduced at high resolution and transferred onto special fabric webs to create highly detailed display panels. This technique allows a true-to-life reproduction of the ceiling and gives visitors a unique opportunity for an otherwise impossible close-up view of his brushwork. Entry fee is £5 online, £6 on the door.



St Peter's, Jewry St Winchester will be showing a short film by Bishop Robert Barron on Michelangelo's Sistine Chapel through the lens of faith during the summer. We hope you enjoy the exhibition and can come to the Parish Centre on Friday afternoons (3pm) to see the short film or on Thursday 18th July, 22nd August and 12th September at 7.30 to see a longer version. Entry is free. All welcome.

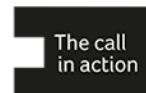
